Northwest Ohio Community Shares Annual Report 2011

The July 1, 2010 - June 30, 2011 period saw a record-breaking growth in new member agencies, as five new agencies came on board in time for the 2011 (Fall) Campaign: Family Promise/IHN, Hannah's Socks, Perrysburg Symphony Chorale, Scrap4Art, and Sylvania Area Family Services. Accepted at our annual meeting on June 13, 2011, these agencies help continue and extend our mission of serving diverse locations and addressing diverse needs in arts, the environment, and families in northwest Ohio. We are especially proud that each of these agencies was founded locally by our own community members.

With the help of UAW Local 14, who donated the use of their union hall, we launched a fun yet low-key new event, the First Annual Sharea-Glass Wine and Beer Tasting. Local distributors contributed beer and wine for our attendees to sample,

member agencies brought appetizers and desserts, and staff provided our first all-agency PowerPoint slide show, highlighting each agency's missions and successes from the previous year. Over 150 folks attended and the event raised almost \$2,000!

2010-2011 also saw the debut of the Northwest Ohio Community Shares Page on Facebook—a new way to highlight agency events and successes throughout the year.


Our seventh annual Hot August Night fundraiser event took place at Fifth Third Field on August 25, 2010. The event had great turnout, a great ballgame—and a great result as we raised \$8,500! The local economy continued to present challenges for fundraising, as the majority of our workplaces experienced cutbacks and layoffs. We were encouraged that our Campaign raised \$196,000, which represents a contraction of less than one percent from the previous year's Campaign. We believe this reflects the loyalty and commitment our donors have maintained for our member agencies and their missions.

Combined with across-the-board cost-cutting by our staff, we have been able to maintain our own mission of providing funds and visibility for member agencies while reducing our overhead.

We are also welcoming new leadership. I would like to extend a hearty welcome and thank you to our new Board President, Mike Bell, who has been serving energetically and effectively as Chair of the Development Committee and will undoubtedly make a positive and tangible impact in his new appointment. The sustained dedication of our donors, workplace managers, member agencies, Board leadership and staff bolsters our optimism and excitement for the upcoming year.
